FORT WORTH, Texas— Exhibitors, owners, trainers, equine enthusiasts and hundreds of the world's most colorful Appaloosas came together June 27- July 9th in Fort Worth, Texas at the Will Rogers Memorial Center for the 2016 World Championship Appaloosa Youth Show! The World Championship Appaloosa Youth Show was held in conjunction with the 69th National Championship Appaloosa Show and hosted by the Appaloosa Horse Club (ApHC) and the American Paint Horse Association's (APHA's) Youth World Championship Show.

The annual event showcased talented Appaloosas and youth from around the globe, all of whom competed for amazing prizes and prestigious titles in over 70 classes! In addition to awards, youth in select classes were eligible to win scholarships through the Appaloosa Foundation. The show featured a variety of disciplines including Cattle, Western, English, Jumping, Games, and Halter!

The last day of the youth show featured the prestigious Champion of Champions Competition sponsored by Deerfield Farm LLC. The Appaloosa Horse Club (ApHC) was established in 1938 with a mission of honoring the heritage and promoting the future of the Appaloosa horse. The ApHC has since registered more than 700,000 Appaloosas, which are known for their distinctive color, intelligence and even temperament. True to their reputation as an extremely versatile breed, Appaloosas can be found in nearly every discipline including racing, endurance riding and serving as reliable family horses. The international breed registry is headquartered in Moscow, Idaho, the heart of the Palouse region—the Appaloosa breed's namesake and point of origin.
