APPALOOSA BEATS QUARTER HORSES TO FINISH LINE

BURLEY, IDAHO—The lone Appaloosa in a pack of swift Quarter Horses crossed the finish line first Aug. 17 in a maiden race at the Cassia County Fairgrounds in Burley, Idaho.

Idaho-bred Rdm It Wasnt Me completed the 250-yard dirt track in 13.554 seconds. The dark bay Appaloosa, ridden by Judd Rasmussen, won \$675 of the \$1,125 purse. Rdm It Wasn't Me, a 3-year-old gelding, is owned by Rex Martin; bred by Kim Hollingsworth; and trained by Dustin Hollingsworth.

Following Rdm It Wasn't Me, was Quarter Horse Toros Sign with Paul Green aboard. The 3-year-old colt finished the race at 13.568 second, and won \$281. Toros Sign is owned by Jorge Murillo and trained by Casey Greene.

Proudest Fantasy (AQHA) finished in third place, crossed the line in 13.771 seconds. The 3-year-old filly, ridden by Wes Smith, won \$169 of the purse. Proudest Fantasy is owned by Hideaway Livestock and trained by Tony Hyde.

Other horses completing the field include—Questionable Deal (AQHA) and Invite the Champ (AQHA).
