## Exemplary Regional Club Award

The first awards will be given in 2007 for accomplishments in 2006. Begin planning your 2006 season now in order to earn points for the award! The exemplary regional club award will be presented annually to the regional club that is a model example for others.

Clubs will be scored on selected criteria. It is each club's responsibility to prove they have met the criteria. Clubs can only obtain one score per category. For example, clubs can only get 25 points for putting on a breed show whether they put on one or more than one. When two or more clubs work together on a project, each club will earn points for the event.

From those clubs that submit reports toward this award, six will advance, one from each territory, to the finalist stage. Each of the six territory finalists will receive a plaque.

From the six finalists, one will be titled the Exemplary Regional Club. The Exemplary Regional Club winner will win a perpetual trophy for one year. In addition, that club will receive \$500, special recognition in *Appaloosa Journal*, complimentary booth space at the National or World show, press releases and recognition during the ApHC annual awards banquet.

The point system will begin January 1 and end December 31 each year. The deadline for submitting reports to the regional club committee for scoring is the last business day in January. Submission forms and supporting information will be provided to the Regional Club

Advisory Committee for initial scoring and final scoring will be made by the Regional Club Committee.

A submission form with scoring criteria will be available on the ApHC web site and available upon request from the Regional Club Coordinator.

Each Regional Club is responsible for documenting supporting information to submit with the submission form to the ApHC. A suggestion for submission would be that the club create a scrapbook of show announcements, newspaper clippings, flyers from expos, Youth scholarship or award notifications etc... and send it to the Regional Club Coordinator with the completed submission form by the annual deadline.

l. Two or more members with stallions nominated in the Breeders' Trust 20

m. Horse expo 25

o. Other media exposure 0-20

p. Increase regional club Membership 1-10 *individual members. Couples & Family memberships: each individual would be counted* 25

q. Increase regional club Membership 11+ *individual members. Couples & Family memberships: each individual would be counted* 30

r. Club youth applied for ApHC scholarship 20

s. Working with other clubs on a project: *ApHC events, 4-H, Charities, Community Organizations, etc..* 25

t. Charity participation *not restricted to equine charities, any charitable group or organization qualifies.* 20

u. Youth Honor program 25

## Fee Waiver for Single Judge Show New for 2006-2007

At the June/July 2005 board meeting, ApHC directors approved eliminating National point fees at single-judge shows for a period of 2 years, beginning in 2006.

### Here's how it works:

1. Approval fees remain intact. (\$25 per judge/show) Minimum class requirements still apply.
2. Shows must be combined with open, all-breed classes and said classes must be intermixed with regular ApHC-approved classes.
3. There are to be a limited selection of basic classes at these shows. However, regional clubs may choose a class list that best reflects the needs of their geographical area. Minimum class requirements as contained in the ApHC rulebook still apply.
4. These single judge shows shall not be held in conjunction with another ApHC-approved show and shall not be held at the same facility within 5 days of another ApHC-approved show.

### Frequently Asked Questions

**Q:** How many Single Judge Shows can a Regional Club hold per year in which National Point Fees are waived?

**A:** No limit on number of shows per year as long as the show(s) go through the standard approval and meet the class requirements.

**Q:** What is the minimum number of horses required for the single judge show?

**A:** 24 horses. All requirements for an ApHC approved event apply.

**Q:** Can a club to hold two shows concurrently in separate rings, hiring a judge that will only judge in the single point show and one judge for the other show?

**A:** No. In order to be eligible to waive the point fees, you may NOT hold shows concurrently or in conjunction with another show.

**Q:** Is it required for the exhibitor to be an ApHC member and/or Regional Club member to earn points in the Single Judge Show?

**A:** They must be an ApHC member to receive national points.

**Q:** Is the horse required to be ApHC registered?

**A:** In ApHC approved shows only horses, including current year foals, registered with the ApHC in the Foundation. Permanent, Tentative, or CPO registry are eligible to participate. Certificate of Registration stamped, "Not eligible for show or exhibition in ApHC-approved events" are not eligible to show at any approved show.

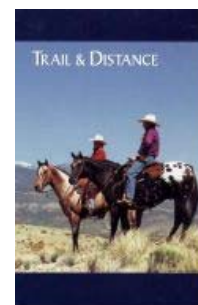
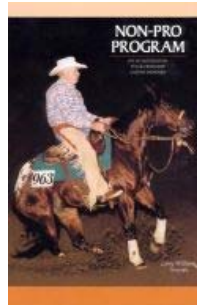
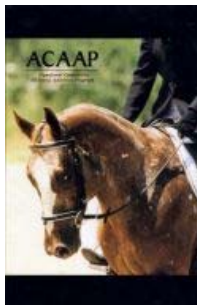
The person requesting the list must be an officer of the regional club according to ApHC records. Membership lists may only be used for the purpose of

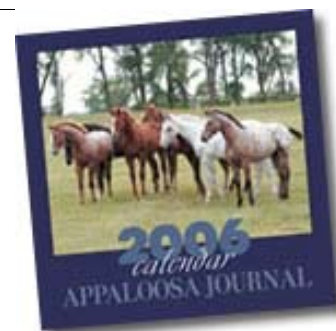

This information must be received in the ApHC office no later than February 15, 2006. Failure to return your report by this deadline will result in a \$50 fine.

## ApHC Youth Information Packets To Be Mailed!

Each regional club's youth advisor will soon be receiving an informational packet in the mail shortly. This packet contains promotional information to encourage the youth in your area to become more actively involved in the many programs and activities the AYA has to offer! Remember, the more active your youth group is, the better chance your regional club will have at earning the Exemplary Regional Club Award (see page 1 for more information).

Enclosed in the packet are brochures advertising the multiple youth contests the ApHC has to offer. These brochures detail the contest rules and entry forms necessary for each youth to become involved. The first contest in 2006 that youth may become involved in is the Regional Youth Club of the Year contest. Youth clubs are encouraged to produce a scrapbook depicting their activities from the previous year and all entries are due on March 1, 2006.

For the young writers, the AYA is offering a new Junior Journalist contest in 2006. Contestants must submit a completed entry form along with a two-page, double-spaced article written about an Appaloosa

icon in their region by April 1, 2006 to become eligible. Winners will be selected to job shadow an *Appaloosa Journal* staff member at the 2006 World Championship Appaloosa Youth Show and asked to highlight an event and their writing will be published!

For the creative Appaloosa youth, the AYA offers the Art, Photo and Essay contests to encourage the expression of their love for the Appaloosa horse. Artwork and essays will be accepted in the ApHC office between January 1 and May 1, 2006 and photos for the Photography contest must be received in the office by May 1, 2006. Winning entries will be on display at the World Championship Appaloosa Youth Show and highlighted in an issue of *Appaloosa Journal*.

If you have an active group of youth in your region that will be headed to the World Championship Appaloosa Youth Show in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, then participating in the Team Tournament Competition will be a memorable experience! Youth teams comprised of various aged members from the same territory compete against other teams in the show pen, the speech contest, and either the stall decorat-

ing contest or the little buckaroo dummy roping contest. Each team must be comprised of no less than three members and no more than eight members. Each team must submit a \$40 entry fee and team nomination forms are due in the office May 31, 2006.

The Appaloosa Youth Foundation annually awards up to eight scholarships of \$1,000 each. One may be awarded in each of the six territories of the Appaloosa Horse Club, one may be awarded at-large, and one may be awarded to a winner from the previous year or seeking additional education in the form of a continuing scholarship. The Sagebrush scholarship may be awarded in the amount of \$2,000 to eligible and deserving youth. All three scholarship applications are due in the ApHC office by June 10, 2006.

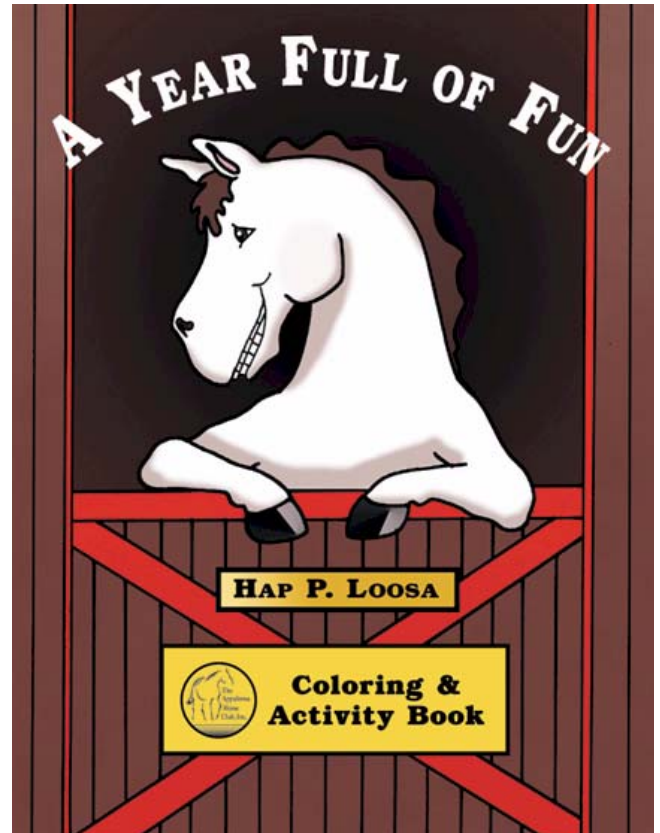

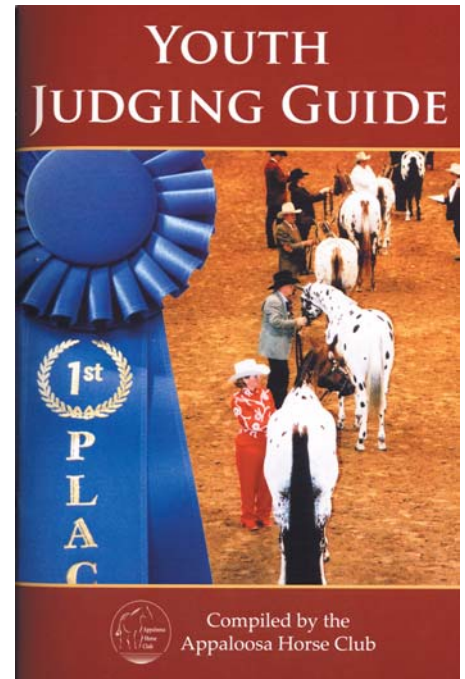

**Election Policy Procedures:** Directors will be elected according to Article IV, Sections 2 and 3 of the ApHC Bylaws. This will be accomplished using this schedule:

FEBRUARY 28, 2006	As per Article IV, Section 2.C. of the Bylaws, "In a regular election, the petition must be <b>submitted on or before</b> the last day of February in the election year..." The affidavit must be signed and notarized before consideration of nomination.
MARCH 15, 2006	Candidate resume and photograph must be received by the ApHC. Membership applications and dues must be received by the ApHC to be eligible to receive ballot.

1. Petitions of candidacy must be submitted on or before the last working day of February in the election year and must be **mailed by receipted delivery service**. A person declaring his/her candidacy must be an active member in good standing and have been an active member in good standing of the ApHC for at least three (3) consecutive years next preceding the applicable election, and residing in the territory and zone from which he/she is to be elected.

The petition must be signed by five active members in good standing for the election year and who are from the same territory as the prospective candidate.

2. Each person signing this declaration must be 2006 member in good standing with the ApHC on February 28, 2006.

3. In order for a member to receive a ballot, he/she must be an active 2006 member in good standing as of March 15 of the election year. Membership fees must be received at the ApHC by this date.

4. In order for ballots to be counted, they must be received at the designated CPA's office by the deadline published on the ballots for the election year. Ballots mailed to ApHC or other addresses will be voided. Duplicate ballots will void both ballots. Votes not on an official ballot form will be voided. Ballots returned voting for more than one candidate will be voided.

5. In the annual election of Directors conducted pursuant to Article IV of the ApHC Bylaws, there will be no mail ballot carried out in any one zone wherein at the close of nominations there is only one candidate for the office of Director for that zone. Pursuant to a motion of

the Board of Directors adopted September 17, 1992, upon certification by the Executive Secretary as to the singular candidate for the office of Director from any zone, the Executive Secretary will cast the singular ballot for the sole nominee who will thereby be deemed elected to the position of Director.

6. The processing of memberships, declaration of candidacy, mailing of ballots and tabulation of votes are subject to the review of a national or regional independent CPA firm. Records of declarations, correspondence, and any other actions taken through the course of an election will be maintained for a period of not less than one year after the completion of said election.

7. Request for inquiry into the proper conduct of any or all election procedures will be honored only upon the approval of a majority of the ApHC Board of Directors; or upon receipt of an appropriate order from a court with jurisdiction thereof.

8. The order of names on the ballot will be alphabetical.

9. Write-in ballots will not be counted.

10. The security of the election procedures will be the responsibility of the CPA firm.

11. The results of all elections shall be sent to the Executive Secretary by the CPA firm.
