CANT BE CAUGHT OUTRUNS COMPETITION

MOSCOW, Idaho— Appaloosa Cant Be Caught powered past the competition at the Speedhorse Graham Farms Derby Trials. The 350-yard trial race for three-year-olds was held at Remington Park in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on March 6, 2015 had a field of seven, of which one was Appaloosa. The purse was valued at \$6,000.

Cant Be Caught (With Intent x Unique Form, AQHA by Rare Form, AQHA) a 3-year-old gelding, had a clear finish under jockey Randy Wilson, beating the favorite, Texas Silk (APHA), to cross the finish line in 17.918 seconds, earning an 78 speed index. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$3,492 for his efforts and brought his lifetime earnings to \$90,455. This gelding is currently owned and bred by John Diediker of Kansas and is trained by Dee Keener.
