BIG ENNIS PROVES HE'S STILL GOT IT

MOSCOW, Idaho— Appaloosa **Big Ennis** duels for the win in Race 7, on March 13, 2015. The 350-yard allowance race for three-year-olds and upward was held at Remington Park in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma with a field of ten, of which two were Appaloosa. The purse was valued at \$18,840.

Big Ennis (Country Chicks Man, AQHA x Texas Union by Moon Lark, AQHA) a 4-year-old gelding, was the winner by a nose under jockey Agustin Silva to cross the finish line in 17.683 seconds, earning a 84 speed index. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$11,070 for his efforts bringing his lifetime earnings to \$43,182. The winning gelding is owned and was bred by Jimmy Maddux of Texas and is trained by Mollie Devereaux.

Show Me Your Glory (With Honors, AQHA x Miss Fancy Layne by R Limited Edition) a 3-year-old colt, finished third under jockey Stormy Smith., to cross the finish line in 17.738 seconds, earning a 83 speed index. The Utah-bred Appaloosa won \$1,864 for his efforts bringing his lifetime earnings to \$6,164. The winning colt is currently owned and was bred by Chris Brandon of Utah and is trained by Charley Hunt.
