CANT BE CAUGHT CAPTURES SPEEDHORSE GRAHAM FARMS DERBY

MOSCOW, Idaho— Appaloosa **Cant Be Caught** powered past the competition in race 12, the Speedhorse Graham Farms Derby. The Grade 1, 350-yard race for three-year-olds was held at Remington Park in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on March 21, 2015 had a field of ten, of which one was Appaloosa. The purse was valued at \$47,100.

Cant Be Caught (With Intent x Unique Form, AQHA by Rare Form, AQHA) a 3-year-old gelding, won handily under jockey Cody Jensen, to cross the finish line in 17.456 seconds, earning an 91 speed index. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$17,898 for his efforts and brought his lifetime earnings to \$108,353. This gelding is currently owned and bred by John Diediker of Kansas and is trained by Jeff Dean.

Appaloosas have long been an integral part of one of America's most popular spectator sports—horse racing. The Appaloosa Horse Club officially recognized the sport in 1962, beginning Appaloosa racing history with four races and 23 starters competing for \$12,000 in total purses. In 2014, 98 starters competed in races for over \$1.7M in total purses. Racing fans can find Appaloosas crossing the finish line in Arizona, California, Idaho, Oklahoma, Oregon, Texas, and Wyoming.
