## CANT BE CAUGHT TAKES NATIONAL COWBOY & WESTERN HERITAGE STAKES

**MOSCOW, Idaho**— Appaloosa **Cant Be Caught** dueled for the win in race 6, the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum Stake. Appaloosas went one-two in the Grade 2, 440-yard race for three-year-olds and older was held at Remington Park in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on May 31, 2015. It had a field of seven, of which three were Appaloosa. The purse was valued at \$34,700.

**Cant Be Caught (With Intent x Unique Form, AQHA by Rare Form, AQHA)** a 3-year-old gelding, had a driving finish under jockey Randy Wilson, to cross the finish line in 21.489 seconds, earning an 96 speed index. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$20,892 for his efforts and brought his lifetime earnings to \$149,867 in 14 starts. This gelding is currently owned and bred by John Diediker of Kansas and is trained by Jeff Dean.

**Major Tom (Red Storm Cat, AQHA x Eyesa Knockout by Mr Eye Opener, AQHA)** a 4-year-old gelding, had a game second finish under jockey Jimmy Brooks, to cross the finish line in 21.645 seconds, earning a 92 speed index. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$6,964 for his efforts bringing his lifetime earnings to \$234,017 in 14 starts. The gelding is currently owned by Mary Hainline of Oklahoma and was bred by Gary Vaughan of Oklahoma and is trained by Eddie Willis.

**Show Me Your Glory (With Honors, AQHA x Miss Fancy Layne by R Limited Edition)** a 3-year-old colt also finished.
