BR PLEASURE CAPTURES HARVEST CUP FUTURITY

MOSCOW, Idaho— Appaloosa **BR Pleasure** went wire to wire in the in the 5th race. The 350-yard Harvest Cup Futurity was for two-year-old Paint and Appaloosas. The race was held at Sandy Downs in Idaho Falls, Idaho on September 13, 2015. It had a field of seven, of which six were Appaloosa. The purse was valued at \$7,150.

BR Pleasure (Lotta Loot, JC x Beautiful Pleasure by O.A. Taylor) a 2-year-old filly, was the easy winner under jockey Tanner Thedford to cross the finish line in 18.402 seconds, earning an 83 speed index. The Idaho-bred filly won \$3,504 taking her lifetime earnings to \$10,319. She was bred by Rex Lewis of Idaho and is owned by Becky Grant of Idaho and trained by Darric Grant.

Red Knight (Flying T Kingofkings x Cleopatras Image by Go Kinda Easy) a 2-year-old gelding finished second under jockey Cody House to cross the finish line in 18.574 seconds, earning a 78 speed index. The Idaho-bred gelding won \$1,501 for the second spot boosting his lifetime earnings to \$11,923. The gelding is owned by Shane and Tavia McVey and bred by Ralph Hartline of Idaho and trained by Don Wheeler.

BG Spider Monkey (The Royal Jester x Fling T Black Widow by O.A. Taylor) a 2-year-old gelding, finished third under jockey Stetson Gordon to cross the finish line in 18.611 seconds, earning a 77 speed index. The Idaho-bred gelding won \$751 for the third spot boosting his lifetime earnings to \$14,017. The Idaho-bred Appaloosa was bred by Rex Lewis of Idaho and is owned by Becky Grant of Idaho and trained by Darric Grant.

Other finishers include **Maples Black Ice, Secret Kiss and Good Lookin Honors.**
