## BURNIN BRIDGES CLAIMS WIN AT CLAREMORE

**MOSCOW, Idaho**— Appaloosa **Burnin Bridges** had a driving finish for the win in race 1. The 300-yard claiming race was for three-year-olds and upward which had never won three races. The race was held at Will Rogers Downs, Claremore, Oklahoma on September 26, 2015. It had a field of six, of which two were Appaloosa. The purse was valued at \$7,600.

**Burnin Bridges (Woodbridge, AQHA x Treats On Me by Phobes Cartel, AQHA)** a 3-year-old colt, had a winning finish under jockey David Hunt, to cross the finish line in 15.621 seconds, earning a 88 speed index. The North Carolina-bred Appaloosa won \$4,296 for his efforts and brought his lifetime earnings to \$12,757. This gelding is currently owned and bred by John Arnold of North Carolina and is trained by Frank Cooper.

**Lady Joy (Real Visions, AQHA x Joyball by Whirling Fastball, AQHA)** a 3-year-old filly, had a fifth place finish under jockey Mario Delgado This filly is currently owned and bred by Gary Vaughan of Oklahoma and is trained by Luis Villafranco.
