## APPALOOSAS TAKE LEAD AT REMINGTON PARK

**Oklahoma City, Okla.**—Appaloosa “Moon Bully” led the track May 13 in a 350-yard optional claiming race at Remington Park in Oklahoma City, Okla. The offered purse was valued at \$17,800.

Moon Bully, a 6-year-old gelding, took charge of the race and made a close finish with Cody Jensen aboard to claim first place in 17.563 seconds. The Tennessee-bred Appaloosa won \$9,684 and brought his lifetime earnings to \$143,598. Moon Bully (Man With The Power, AQHA x Tb Fancy Moon) is proudly owned by Dub Seely of Sallisaw, Okla., was bred by John W. Holley of Mount Juliet, Tenn., and is trained by Tina Seely.

G I Jana, a 5-year-old mare, tried to overtake Moon Bully and made a close second with Adalberto Candanosa astride in 17.599 seconds. The Kansas-bred Appaloosa won \$4,008 and brought her lifetime earnings to \$83,159. G I Jana (Brisco County Jr, AQHA x Sure Nuff Fast) is owned by Jana Harrison of Stonewall, Okla., was bred by Ronald Fowler of Chanute, Kans., and is trained by Luis Villafranco.
