MOON BULLY CLEANS UP AT REMINGTON PARK

Oklahoma City, Okla.— Moon Bully, as the lone Appaloosa, led the track May 22 at the 450-yard National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum Stake Race at Remington Park in Oklahoma City, Okla. The offered purse was valued at \$31,000.

Moon Bully, a 6-year-old gelding, took charge of the race and made two lengths finish with Cody Jensen astride to claim first place in 21.830 seconds. The Tennessee-bred Appaloosa won \$18,000 and brought his lifetime earnings to \$161,598. Moon Bully (Man With The Power, AQHA x Tb Fancy Moon) is proudly owned by Dub Seely of Sallisaw, Okla., was bred by John W. Holley of Mount Juliet, Tenn., and is trained by Tina Seely.

Other horses in the race included: Cutrock (APHA), Bust N Moves (APHA), Got Country Grip (APHA), Dodacious (APHA), Jungle Jack (APHA), and Audit (APHA).

The Appaloosa Horse Club (ApHC) officially recognized the sport in 1962, beginning Appaloosa racing history with four races and 23 starters competing for \$12,000 in total purses.
