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“VELVET COWGIRL” ROUNDS UP FAIR MEADOWS

Tulsa, Okla.—Appaloosa “Velvet Cowgirl” took the lead on the track June 20 at the Strike It Rich Stallion Futurity, a 350-yard futurity race at Fair Meadows in Tulsa, Okla. The race was valued at \$22,300.

Velvet Cowgirl, a 2-year-old filly, dueled against Jets A Blazin finishing a length ahead with Berkley Packer aboard to claim first place in 18.376 seconds. The Utah-bred Appaloosa won \$7,352 and brought her lifetime earnings to \$9,247. Velvet Cowgirl (Takin the Cash Out x Miss Texas Velvet) is owned by Brad Anderson of Detroit, Texas, was bred by Kevin and Jeannie Hullinger of Mona, Utah, and trained by Mike Taylor.

Second place, ahead of “Look Here Boys” just by a nose, went to “Jets A Blazin” with Bryan Ernst astride. Jets A Blazin, a 2-year-old filly, made a solid effort throughout the entire race but came up short on the going away. Jets A Blazin (Geneo JJ x Blazing Jet) won \$4,901 and is owned and bred by E. Bruce Miller.

Look Here Boys took third place by an astounding 3 ¾ lengths ahead of “Miss Texas Hold Em”. The 2-year-old filly fought gamely throughout the entire race and only lost second by a nose. Ridden by William Ives, Look Here Boys made a big effort and earned \$2,942. She is owned by Kevin Hullinger.

Other Appaloosas in the race include: Justice B Kas, and Fishin With Intent.

Appaloosa Racing

Appaloosas have long been an integral part of one of America’s most popular spectator sports—horse racing. The Appaloosa Horse Club (ApHC) officially recognized the sport in 1962, beginning Appaloosa racing history with four races and 23 starters competing for \$12,000 in total purses. In 2009, 157 Appaloosas competed in 305 races for \$2.7 million in total purses.

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
