APPALOOSA STORMS INTO LEAD

Tulsa, Okla.—Appaloosa “Oklahoma Rane” went wire to wire on the track July 1 in the 300-yard maiden race at Fair Meadows in Tulsa, Okla. The race was valued at \$8,700.

Oklahoma Rane, a 3-year-old gelding, made an impressive win with William Ives aboard claiming first place, by a length, in 15.676 seconds. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$4,934 and brought his lifetime earnings to \$7,000. While earning a speed index of 92 in this race, Oklahoma Rane (Okey Dokey Dale_{AQHA} x Go Raney Cloud) won on the going away. He is owned by Ramon Hernandez of Caddo, Okla. He was bred by Kin Pirtle of Norman, Okla., and is trained by Zac Coates.

Bugs Eye View, a 3-year-old mare, made a solid effort, but the winner was too tuff. Although she was disqualified from second place for bothering her foes, Bugs Eye View earned a speed index of 87. She is owned and trained by Liz Horner and bred by Donna J Landon.

Other horses in the race include: Dashing Razzamatazz (APHA), Turnpike Oh Seven (APHA), Streakin Rainbow (ApHC), Star Dash (ApHC), Kittys Contender (APHA), Wranglers Bully (APHA), and Aze Chick (APHA).
