APPALOOSA GAMELY TAKES THE LEAD

Tulsa, Okla.—Appaloosa “Streakin Rainbow” went wire to wire on the track July 23 in the 250-yard maiden claiming race at Fair Meadows in Tulsa, Okla. The race was valued at \$6,200.

Streakin Rainbow, a 3-year-old gelding, kept to task with Tony Bennett aboard claiming first place, by half a length, in 13.554 seconds. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$3,380 and brought his lifetime earnings to \$8,232. While earning a speed index of 86 in this race, Streakin Rainbow (Separate Rainbow_{AQHA} x Gertrude Louise) won with a game effort. He is owned by Melannie Patton of Kiowa, Okla. He was bred by John C. Diediker of Parsons, Kan., and is trained by Angie Jones.

Other horses in the race include: Judys Chrome Girl_{APHA}, Dashin Razzamatazz_{APHA}, Honey Am At The Track_{APHA}, Sovereign Nation_{APHA}, Feleshas Rainbow_{ApHC}, This Is My Country_{APHA}, Jessica Lee_{APHA}, teller I Was Hear_{APHA}, and Crank It Up_{ApHC}.

Appaloosa Racing

Appaloosas have long been an integral part of one of America’s most popular spectator sports—horse racing. The Appaloosa Horse Club (ApHC) officially recognized the sport in 1962, beginning Appaloosa racing history with four races and 23 starters competing for \$12,000 in total purses. In 2009, 157 Appaloosas competed in 305 races for \$2.7 million in total purses.
