APPALOOSAS BRING IN THE MONEY IN AUGUST RACES

MOSCOW, Idaho—Appaloosas tore up the tracks and made big money in August 2008. Three Appaloosas stood out in the winners' circles and proved that Appaloosas are the fastest color breed on the tracks!

Rock N Roll Ruby, a 2-year-old Appaloosa filly, dominated an Aug. 8 maiden race at Blue Ribbon Downs in Sallisaw, Okla. The 300-yard race offered a \$6,300 purse, and Rock N Roll Ruby walked off the track with \$3,600. The Colorado-bred Appaloosa has earned \$11,396 in her racing lifetime. This top notch racing filly is by Erlton (JC) and out of Ask Her Faster (ApHC). Rock N Roll Ruby is proudly owned and bred by Dr. John V. White of Fort Collins, Colo., and is trained by Dee Keener.

Appaloosa, Runordie, smoked her competition in 330-yard maiden race at Blue Ribbon Downs Aug. 22. The 3-year-old filly won \$3,600 of the \$6,550 purse. Runordie has earned \$9,487 in her racing career. The Texas-bred filly is by Streakin Waddie (AQHA) and out of Zips Maggie Mae (ApHC). Runordie is proudly owned by Anita L. Ruiz of Wapanucka, Okla., bred by Cal Gunter and is trained by Luis Villafranco.

Three-year-old Appaloosa filly, Cashes Rosie, won a large purse at her Aug. 23 allowance race at Blue Ribbon Downs. The game winner earned \$5,335 out of the \$9,450 purse for the 330-yard race, bringing Cashes Rosie's lifetime earnings to \$10,268. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa is by Troubled Memories (ApHC) and out of Kicken Cash (ApHC). Cashes Rosie is proudly owned and trained by Angie J. Jones of Stuart, Okla., and was bred by Kathie Cooper and Grant Thompson.

Appaloosas have long been an integral part of one of America's most popular spectator sports—horse racing. The Appaloosa Horse Club (ApHC) officially recognized the sport in 1962, beginning Appaloosa racing history with four races and 23 starters competing for \$12,000 in total purses. In 2007, 197 starters competed in 441 races for \$2,725,151 in total purses.

Racing fans can find Appaloosas crossing the finish line in Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nevada, Oklahoma, Oregon, Texas, Washington and Wyoming.
