Moscow, Idaho— The Appaloosa Horse Club is pleased to announce the 2014 year-end award winners.

Youth Superior Achievement Champions:

The Youth Superior Achievement Champion is a lifetime award that is presented to youth who has accumulated 350 points under at least 5 different judges. A minimum of 105 points must be earned at Showmanship at Halter, a minimum of 140 points must be earned in Performance classes (with at least 35 points in three of four performance subcategories) and the remaining 105 points may be earned in elective youth classes.

The Youth Versatility Champion Award is an annual award given to the youth who earns the most points with one horse in youth events. It is presented in four age categories and calculated on a one horse-one youth basis.
