AYA ANNOUNCES 2017 SPEECH CONTEST WINNERS

Moscow, Idaho— The Appaloosa Youth Association (AYA) is pleased to announce the winners of the 2017 AYA Speech Contest. This exciting competition is held annually in conjunction with the Youth World Championship Appaloosa Show. Teams participating in the Team Tournament Challenge are required to enter into this competition, but individual youth participants are welcome and highly encouraged to take part. Participants can compete in one of two divisions: prepared and impromptu.

This year the topic for the 13 & under prepared division was “Who is your favorite Appaloosa Hall of Fame horse or person and why?” The topic for the prepared 14-18 division was “Responsible Horse Ownership: What does it mean?”

For the impromptu division of the contest participants under the age of 13 were asked what makes their appaloosa unique. Participants between the ages of 14 and 18 taking part in the impromptu division were asked to identify one challenge facing the equine industry and propose a solution to that challenge.
