ApHC ANNUAL STALLION SERVICE AUCTION

MOSCOW, Idaho—The Appaloosa Horse Club's (ApHC) annual Stallion Service Auction will kick off on December 14, 2017 and run through December 16, 2017 ending at 8 pm Eastern time. This year's lineup boasts multiple world class stallions and is powered by EquineAuctionExchange.com.

The ApHC Stallion Service Auction allows breeders to select from some of the top stallions in the country and bid for their chance to win a breeding to their chosen stallion. Stallions eligible for the Stallion Service Auction include ApHC registered horses and ApHC approved outcross stallions such as Quarter Horse, Thoroughbred and Arabian registered horses. The stallion owner and the mare owner purchasing the breeding receive a free nomination in the renowned World Championship Appaloosa Incentive Classes. In 2017, the three incentive classes paid out over \$42,000.

New incentive classes for 2018 auction gives the foal an opportunity to be in NEW weanling halter incentive class for 2019, yearling class (Yearling lunge line and yearling in-hand trail) for 2020 and two-year-old classes (yet to be determined) for 2021. These classes will be Owner/Exhibitor only.

In addition, any other offspring foaled in the same year as the resulting foal from a donated and sold stallion service may be nominated for the World Show Incentive Classes by paying the \$750 nomination fee.

At this time the ApHC is still accepting stallions to be entered into the auction.
