MIA BOLD OKEY CAPTURES OKLAHOMA WINNERS CIRCLE

MOSCOW, Idaho— Appaloosa **Mia Bold Okey** prevailed for the win in race 8 at the summer meet in Tulsa. The 350-yard allowance race was for three-year-olds and upward which had never won two races. The race was held at Fair Meadows in Tulsa, Oklahoma on July 23, 2015. It had a field of eight, of which four were Appaloosa. The purse was valued at \$8,300.

Mia Bold Okey (Okey Dokey Dale, AQHA x Miss Bold Z by Bold Clipper, AQHA) a 3-year-old filly, had a dueling finish under jockey Yordanis Amaro, to cross the finish line in 17.905 seconds, earning an 81 speed index. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$4,838 for her efforts and brought her lifetime earnings to \$13,838. This filly is currently owned by John Rene Rodriguez and was bred by Bill Conley Sr of Oklahoma and is trained by Donald Davidson, Jr.

Ivory King (Ivory James, AQHA x Sure Nuff Fast by Bills Ryon, AQHA) a 3-year-old colt, had a second place finish under jockey Mario Delgado, to cross the finish line in 17.962 seconds, earning an 80 speed index. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$1,746 for his efforts and brought his lifetime earnings to \$13,990. This colt is currently owned and bred by Gary Vaughan of Oklahoma and is trained by Luis Villafranco.

Lady Joy (Real Visions, AQHA x Joyball by Whirling Fastball, AQHA) a 3-year-old filly finished fourth under jockey Daniel Torres. The filly is owned and bred by Gary Vaughan and trained by Luis Villafranco.

Red Moon First (TMA Moonshine x Red Bird's Honor, JC by Saxton, JC) a 3-year-old colt finished under jockey Paul Nieto. The colt is owned by Noemi Billicana and was bred by Dinzil Powell and trained by Oscar Nunez.
