CANT BE CAUGHT SETS RECORD AT DON DRAKE MEMORIAL HANDICAP

MOSCOW, Idaho— Appaloosa **Cant Be Caught** may have finished third overall in race 11, at the Don Drak Memorial Handicap, but he still set a new Appaloosa track record. The 350-yard race for three-year-olds was held at Will Rogers Downs in Claremore, Oklahoma on October 23, 2015. It had a field of six, of which only one was Appaloosa. The purse was valued at \$16,552.

Cant Be Caught (With Intent x Unique Form, AQHA by Rare Form, AQHA) a 3-year-old gelding, had a game third finish under jockey Randy Wilson, to cross the finish line in 17.701 seconds, earning an 90 speed index and beating the old record of 17.91 seconds set in 2013 by Douxremilily. The Oklahoma-bred Appaloosa won \$1,816 for his efforts and brought his lifetime earnings to \$155,228 in 16 starts. This gelding is currently owned and bred by John Diediker of Kansas and is trained by Dee Keener.

The Appaloosa Horse Club officially recognized the sport in 1962, beginning Appaloosa racing history with four races and 23 starters competing for \$12,000 in total purses.
